To stay on track for SDSU Global Campus online degree completion, you should:

Complete the Microsite Degree Program Interest Form

Review the Transfer Admission Requirements

Meet the CSU Criteria

- 60 or more transferable semester units (90 or more quarter units) completed
- American Institution (can be completed before graduation)
- Completion of lower division GE with a grade of C- or higher to include the Golden 4 requirements:
 - Area A1 - Oral Communication
 - Area A2 - Written Communication
 - Area A3 - Critical Thinking
 - Area B4 - Quantitative Reasoning
- Pass the **Writing Placement Assessment** with a score of 10, or Rhetoric and Writing Studies 305W or Linguistics 305W with a grade of C (2.0) or better once admitted to the program. Please visit wpa.sdsu.edu for the latest information on this requirement.

Meet the Degree Program Criteria

- Required GPA based on program
 - Business Administration: minimum of 2.75+
 - Communication: minimum of 2.75+
 - Child Development: minimum of 2.4+
 - Criminal Justice: minimum of 2.8+
- Completion of lower division preparation for the major requirements
 - Business Administration: 27 units
 - Communication: 6 units
 - Child Development: 27-28 units
 - Criminal Justice: 12 units
- Transfer Resources: **SDSU Tap** and **Assist.org**

Meet with your academic advisor/transfer counselor to ensure you are on track to meet SDSU admission requirements

- Admission decisions are made after the application period has closed.
- You will be notified via email once an admission decision has been rendered.
- Do not send transcripts unless you are offered admission.
