Travelers crisscrossed the region of Wadi el-Hudi for thousands of years, leaving both rock art and archaeological remains. Pastoral nomads frequently utilized the area either for their own mining, gathering other desert products, or tending their herds. Recent surveys and excavations at Wadi el-Hudi have been able to elucidate the communities of the desert and how they interacted with communities in the Nile Valley.

This talk will share new finds to demonstrate the busy, complex, and vibrant communities of the desert and how they interacted with the people of the Nile.
